## Theme and Purpose

READER 3

READER 1

Remember that I left heaven to come search for you and be with you.

Remember that when a crowd pressed round me, I sensed the touch of one person and turned to meet her need.

Remember in the lilies of the field and in the bird on the wing that I care for them and for you.

READER 2

Remember me when you face trials, when your faith is shaken, when you feel defeated by all-too familiar sin. Remember that I have conquered death, hell and the grave.

READER 3

Remember me in your day of joy and all through your night of sorrow. Remember I am with you always.

READER 1

Remember me in the love of brothers and sisters, in the hug of a child, in the face of the hurting and of the lost.

READER 2

Remember my promise that I will never leave you or forsake and that I will one day come back for you.

READER 3

Remember the tears I shed and the drops of blood I bled.

Remember as you take this bread and this cup that I live through you. And all you remember about me can be true also of you.

Take, eat and drink. Do this in remembrance of me.
